

Hudson man's lawsuit accuses Brother Guy Beaulieu of molesting him repeatedly in the 1970s

MASTUDA — A 42-year-old Hudson man has accused a former Bishop Guertin High School teacher of sexually abusing him more than 100 times before he quit the school as a junior in 1975, according to a lawsuit filed Monday.

Kevin Dandley claims that Brother Guy Beaulieu began molesting him in 1973 at a Catholic summer camp in Gilmanton when he was 14. When Beaulieu, who worked at Camp Fatima during school breaks, learned that Dandley was from Nashua, Beaulieu befriended him and began "grooming" Dandley for sexual abuse, according to the lawsuit.

Dandley entered Bishop Guertin the next fall, and the abuse continued at the school, according to the suit. The abuse occurred in public places at the school as well as behind locked doors in Beaulieu's bedroom, until Dandley left the school after Beaulieu tried to force the boy to perform oral sex, the suit states.

Attorney Peter Hutchins, who is representing Dandley and another client who alleges sexual abuse at the hands of former BG teacher Brother ~~Argeneo~~ Argeneo, said the high school should live up to what it teaches, which is to admit when you are wrong and atone for your mistakes.

Yet there is no proof the school did anything wrong, countered BG lawyer David Pinosmeant. Allegations, such as the ones in this suit, need to be proved, he said.

"I haven't seen evidence that supports a claim that BG is legally or morally responsible to Mr. Hutchins' clients," Pinosmeant said. "That's the reason the school doesn't have a moral obligation to settle this case today — and, by the way, this is

about legal obligations."

Dandley's suit does not seek a specific amount of money, but Hutchins said his client hopes that the suit will help him to recoup the loss of a productive, promising life.

For Bishop Guertin, Hutchins said, it seems to be all about the money.

"When it comes to this kind of stuff, it seems they are more interested in the addition they are putting on their building than taking care of their former students who have been sexually abused," Hutchins said. He said the school has a moral obligation to do what is right.

"I'm disappointed with comments like that," Pinosmeant said. "The school has no obligation to either one of his clients until it is shown they are responsible for something."

After the abuse, Dandley never went back to high school, according to the suit. Instead, he "began a life that was dominated and ruined by alcohol and substance abuse," the suit states. Dandley was twice convicted of driving while intoxicated, and in 1989, he was hospitalized for seizures caused by his alcohol

abuse, the suit states.

In 1997, when Dandley was offered counseling as part of a severance package from a former job, he disclosed for the first time that he had been sexually

abused, according to the suit. It was not until that time that Dandley realized the sexual abuse was behind his problems, the suit states.

Last summer, Dandley was arrested and charged with aggravated felonious sexual assault. The case was dropped in January due to "proof issues," and the decision appeared to be in the best interest of the alleged victim, according to Assistant County Attorney Patricia Benner.

"If you read the literature, it says the abused can become abusers, but that's not Kevin at all," Hutchins said.

Hutchins also represents another man, Jeffrey Linton of Alton, Va., who alleged in a similar lawsuit filed last month that Argeneo molested him in 1974, primarily during tutoring sessions in Argeneo's residence at the school. Argeneo, who had been working as the school's student activities coordinator, was removed from the school in January.

Because of the statute of limitations, criminal charges are unlikely in either case.

Monday's lawsuit, filed in Hillsborough County Superior Court, names Beaulieu, the school and the Brothers of the Sacred Heart, the religious order based in Bartonsville, R.I., that owns and operates the school.

The Diocese of Manchester, which owns Camp Fatima, is not named in the suit, Hutchins said, however, that Dandley is a part of a class-action lawsuit he filed last month against the diocese.

Beaulieu began teaching at the school in the 1970s and left in 1990, when he moved to the religious order's Rhode Island retirement home.

Pinosmeant said Beaulieu left in 1990 due to issues of insubordination that had nothing to do with alleged sexual abuse.

Pinosmeant said neither he nor BG President Leo Labbe had heard of Dandley or his allegations before Monday. Labbe was unavailable for comment Monday.

"I've seen the accusations and I don't know if they're accurate," Pinosmeant said. "We're dancing with shadows. I don't know what happened. I don't know who saw what."

	<p>On 04 Jan. 02 at approximately 1415 hours, this detective responded to Lt. Gerald Evan's office where I made contact with Lt. Evans, [REDACTED] and his Attorney, Barbara Landry, regarding allegations made by Mr. [REDACTED] of sexual assaults against him which occurred while he was a student at Bishop Guertin High School in the early 1970's. This detective had reviewed a letter sent to Lt. Evans by Mr. [REDACTED] which had outlines a pattern of sexual assaults committed on Mr. [REDACTED] by a teacher at the school who Mr. [REDACTED] identified as "Brother Roger", and that these assaults included Brother Roger fondling [REDACTED] performing fellatio on him, and sodomizing him. It should be noted that Mr. [REDACTED] is currently 42 years of age, which excludes him from pursuing this matter criminally due to the criteria requirements for reporting sexual assaults. Lt. Evans explained this to Mr. [REDACTED] and Atty. Landry at length, and also advised that the Nashua Police Dept. cannot conduct an investigation for the purpose of any civil litigation which may occur as a result of these allegations. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that Atty. Landry had advised him that criminal charges were out of the question, however he stated his motivation for coming forth with these allegations stem from the fact that his nephew is currently enrolled at Bishop Guertin, and that he has heard that Brother Roger is still employed at the school. He did not wish to see anyone else be assaulted by him. It is the position of the Nashua Police Dept. that although this matter cannot be investigated to the point of arrest for these allegations, there are concerns that there could be possible victims who may not have come forward. Lt. Evans requested this detective to take a statement from Mr. [REDACTED] and initiate a police information report regarding the matter.</p> <p>At that time, this detective, [REDACTED] and Atty. Landry responded to a YSD interview room where a formal statement was taken. Mr. [REDACTED] detailed a pattern of assaults which began on an unknown date in 1974 when he was a freshman at BG. He advised that he was having difficulty in his history class, which was being taught by Brother Roger. [REDACTED] advised that his parents, the principal of BG, and Brother Roger, met and decided that [REDACTED] should receive tutoring from Brother Roger in the afternoon after school in Brother Roger's room located within BG. [REDACTED] advised that the first couple of tutoring sessions went fine, however on the third session Brother Roger fondled his buttocks and crotch areas over his clothing. He advised that he "was terrified", and did not tell anyone about the incident. He advised that during the next sessions these assaults became more graphic, and that Brother Roger began to undo his pants and fondle his penis and buttocks. [REDACTED] stated that the tutoring sessions began to become nothing more then Brother Roger assaulting him. He stated that Brother Roger began to perform fellatio on him during these sessions, and that Brother Roger would masturbate while doing this. He advised that on two separate occasions Brother Roger sodomized him while in his room, on a table top.</p> <p>[REDACTED] stated that these assaults continued at a rate of 2-3 times a week for several months, and estimated that Brother Roger assaulted him 3-40 times. He advised that Brother Roger never threatened him about telling anyone about the assaults. He advised that he was "confused and scared", and was ashamed about what was happening to him. He felt that he</p>

would get into trouble or bring shame upon himself if he told anyone about the assaults. He mentioned that he did not tell anyone about the assaults until recently. Through counseling and the support of his wife he decided to come forward with these allegations. [REDACTED] advised that he plans to tell his parents about the allegations during the weekend.

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[REDACTED] advised that he was going to view a 1974 BG yearbook this weekend and attempt to positively identify Brother Roger. He advised that he would contact me should he make the ID. At the time, the interview was completed and I escorted [REDACTED] and Attorney Landry back to the NPD lobby where contact with them was terminated.



On the above-listed date and time Atty Barbara Landry met with this writer at the Nashua Police Department in re the listed investigation. Atty Landry advised that following Det Dunham's interview of [redacted] on 4 Jan 02, [redacted] responded to his parent's home, and located a copy of the BG Yearbook from 1974, which had belonged to his brother, [redacted]. She provided this writer with a sworn statement from [redacted] indicating that the person he described in his interview with Det Dunham as Brother Roger, was the person depicted in the Mitre 1974 BG Yearbook on the page adjacent to page 70, as Brother Roger Argencourt.

Atty Landry had the yearbook with her, but [redacted] was not present. This writer looked at the yearbook, and observed the picture of Brother Roger Argencourt. He was also observed in two other photos, which appeared to refer to him as "hot lips." This writer took photocopies of the yearbook pages in question, and returned the book to Atty Landry.

The investigation will be furthered by Det Dunham, in an attempt to locate any corroborating witnesses, as alleged by [redacted] and in order to interview Brother Roger Argencourt in re the original assaults. [redacted] has advised in his contact with NPD that his nephew, who now attends the school, was asked by Brother Roger, if he was related to [redacted] and this has caused [redacted] to be concerned for the well-being of his nephew.

On 8JAN02 at app. 0945 hours, this detective and Lt. Gerald Evans responded to the Bishop Guertin High School located at 194 Lund Road in an effort to make contact with Brother Roger Argencourt regarding allegations of sexual assaults he committed against a former student in 1974. Upon arrival, I met with Brother Argencourt in his office and advised him the nature of our visit and requested that he respond to NPD for an interview. He agreed to voluntarily respond to NPD and advised he would be there shortly. I responded back to NPD to await his arrival. At app. 1050 hours, I met Brother Argencourt in the lobby and escorted him to an YSD interview room. Det. Thomas MacLeod and myself then advised Brother Argencourt of the specific nature of the allegations against him.

At that time, Brother Argencourt advised that he did recall the student in question, [Redacted] and made admissions that he had in fact engaged in sexual activity with him during the time frames which we had discussed with him. Brother Argencourt advised that he recalled that [Redacted] was in his history class and that he was getting poor grades. He stated that he agreed to tutor [Redacted] and that during these sessions he began to fondle [Redacted] genitals over his clothing. He advised that this progressed to him touching [Redacted] penis directly and eventually to him performing oral sex on [Redacted]. He advised that he recalled performing oral sex on [Redacted] numerous times, and stated that he did recall placing his penis inside of [Redacted] buttocks/anus on 2 occasions.

When Brother Argencourt was advised of the number of times [Redacted] advised these assaults occurred, he stated "I have no reason not to believe that number", stated that if [Redacted] advised that it happened 20-30 times, he felt that was number was probably accurate. He advised that in 1978, he went to San Gre De Cristo retreat in New Mexico for a "renewal session" lasting 100 days and at during this time, he advised a "spiritual councilor" about the assaults in an effort to address the problem. He stated that he spent several years in missionary work in Africa and also worked at Mt St. Charles School in Woonsocket, RI, before returning to BG in 1986. He advised that during the time of his encounters with [Redacted] there was another student, [Redacted] (unk on spelling of last name) who he touched in an inappropriate manner, however never to the extent of what was taking place with [Redacted]. Brother Argencourt advised that he did fondle [Redacted] genitals over the clothing and "wrestled" with [Redacted] on some wrestling mats which were located on the stage of the gym. He advised that during one of these "wrestling sessions" he did rub up against [Redacted] in a "grinding or humping manner" and did have an orgasm. He advised that [Redacted] may never have known that he was touching him in a sexual manner.

Brother Argencourt adamantly advised that [Redacted] and [Redacted] were the only two students that he ever touched or assaulted. He maintained that there were no other victims in any of the locations where he has worked since these assaults took place in 1974. Brother Argencourt also maintained that no personnel at Bishop Guertin High School were aware of these assaults and that he never discussed them with anyone at the school. He stated that he did have a spiritual advisor in Hudson, NH, and, like the advisor in NM, he did confide in him about the assaults. He mentioned that he did not give the names of the victims to the advisors, but did admit to the assaults.

Listed detectives took a tape recorded statement from Mr. Argencourt and again inquired about the possibility other or more current victims. He once more denied any additional victims other than [Redacted] and [Redacted]. At the conclusion of the interview, listed detectives advised Brother Argencourt that we would not be pursuing any criminal charges against him and that the statute of limitations had expired due to [Redacted] age. He was thanked for his time and cooperation and I escorted him back to the NPD lobby where my contact with him was terminated.

[REDACTED] This detective was able to contact Mr. [REDACTED] at his place of employment which is [REDACTED] on his cellular telephone of [REDACTED] Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he is a Maintenance Supervisor for [REDACTED] I advised Mr. [REDACTED] the nature of the investigation, and inquired from him if he was a student at the Bishop Guertin High School, Nashua, New Hampshire, during the 1970's. He indicated that he was from 1974 through 1978, and I indicated to him that I was conducting an investigation of an alleged sexual abuse involving a [REDACTED] from 1974. I then stated to him that [REDACTED] had provided information to the Nashua Police Dept. that he was the victim of numerous sexual assaults by brother Roger Argencourt, and that Mr. [REDACTED] indicated that [REDACTED] had supposedly witnessed one of these sexual assaults. Mr. [REDACTED] stated that he can not recall at this time as to whether he did so, but would check with his father, [REDACTED]. He did state that [REDACTED] was in his history class in 1974, and that Brother Roger Argencourt was his teacher during that time frame. He also indicated that Brother Roger would joke and fool around with [REDACTED] in the classroom, but never had an occasion to do the same with him, because he felt that his father's position within the school precluded Brother Roger from doing so. He went on to state that the history class that he was in with [REDACTED] was located above the gymnasium, and that it was extremely hot within that classroom, and that the ventilation was very poor. He did state that Brother Roger was overweight during that period of time, and that he would perspire on a regular basis due to the poor ventilation. I inquired from [REDACTED] as to whether he was familiar with any bathrooms or storage areas in and around the classroom are where the history class was

occurring, and he stated that he was not familiar with any bathrooms, but that he did know there was storage rooms near the classroom, and you had to access them through a hallway that always remained locked. I asked him if he mentioned any type of sexual assaults to his father during the time he was a student there, and he stated that he can not recall, but that his father's memory is better than his, and he will be checking with him in regard to that. He went on to indicate that he was with his father on several occasions when they went into the residence of where the Brothers lived on the school ground, and never saw any students with Brother Roger while he was there. He did state, however, that he observed other students with other Brothers within the residence, but that he did not witness any type of sexual abuse on those students during that time frame. He did state that there was one Brother that was on the faculty at Bishop Guertin that he did not care for, and gave him bad feelings, but that that Brother is now in a retirement home in some unknown location. I asked him if he would explain in detail what he was referring to, and he stated that after a Freshman basketball game this Brother, unknown name, touched his arm, and he subsequently pushed the Brother away because he felt very uncomfortable with him doing this. I asked Mr. [REDACTED] if he has an occasion to recollect any details of possible sexual abuse involving Brother Roger Argencourt to contact this detective with that information. At approximately 1355 hours my contact ended with [REDACTED] and I thanked him for his time and assistance in this matter.

On 14JAN02 at app. 1130 hours, this detective contacted [redacted] telephonically [redacted] and advised him that his name had surfaced in a sexual assault investigation alleging that he was a victim of a sexual assault at the Bishop Guertin High School in the 1970's. I asked if he could respond to NPD at which time I could provide him with more detailed information regarding the investigation and possibly take a formal statement from him. He agreed to come to NPD at 1300 hours for an interview.

At 1300 hours, I made contact with [redacted] in the lobby and escorted him to a YSD interview room. Once there, this writer and Detective Thomas MacLeod advised [redacted] the details of the investigation, specifically that Brother Roger Argencourt had made admissions that he had groped and fondled [redacted] penis and touched him in an inappropriate manner in an area adjacent to the gymnasium while [redacted] was a student of his at Bishop Guertin High School sometime in the mid 1970's. We advised [redacted] that Brother Argencourt had made these admissions while being interviewed for a unrelated sexual assault investigation, and that our motivation for interviewing [redacted] was to verify if the assault had occurred and determine [redacted] desire regarding possible prosecution.

At that time, [redacted] advised that he was in fact fondled by Brother Argencourt during the time frame mentioned and that this incident did happen adjacent to the gym. [redacted] stated that Brother Argencourt had approached him earlier in the day and asked to see him later in the day to conduct a student assessment which was designed to determine personality traits and possible vocational direction. [redacted] advised that he showed up in the area near the gym and made contact with Brother Argencourt for the assessment. [redacted] advised that he completed the assessment and that Brother Argencourt advised him the results of the assessment indicated that he had a passive personality. [redacted] advised that at that time, he somehow ended up on the floor with Brother Argencourt and that Brother Argencourt was fondling his penis, first on the outside of his clothing, and eventually inside his pants directly on his penis. [redacted] advised that he was terrified during this assault and didn't know what to do. He advised that the assault went on for several moments and then stopped abruptly. [redacted] stated that Brother Argencourt advised him after the assault that "there isn't anything you can do about it", which [redacted] assumed that Brother Argencourt was insinuating that if he reported the incident that nothing would happen. [redacted] advised that after the assault, he never told anyone about it until telling listed detectives about it on today's date. [redacted] advised that after the incident, he made sure that he did not put himself in a position where he would be alone with Brother Argencourt to insure that it would not happen again. He stated that he never heard any rumors about any other assault involving Brother Argencourt and that he mainly stayed away from him for the remainder of his time at BG. At that time, a formal tape recorded statement was taken from [redacted]. Listed detectives advised [redacted] that he is within the statues of limitations for prosecuting Brother Argencourt and that he could be arrested and charged if that was [redacted] desire. [redacted] stated that he would have to think about that and discuss it with his wife. We gave [redacted] our cards and advised him to contact us with his decision when he felt comfortable and that we would further the matter at that time. [redacted] was then escorted back to the lobby where contact with him was terminated.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. Do you recall this individual's name?

[REDACTED] To the best of my recollection, it is, ah, Father Roger. He was the history teacher there.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. And, what year was this, to the best of your recollection?

[REDACTED] Um, 1974...., 73.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. Can you describe this man, please?

[REDACTED] Ah, probably six foot tall. Um, 220 or 230 pounds. Ah, squarish type face. Ah, jet black hair with a fu-man-chu mustache. Um, pot belly. Always wore his black robe. Um, very stout, um, type man.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And you named him as Brother Roger. Is that right?

[REDACTED] Yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. In your letter here you mention Brother Rogers. But this is Brother Roger, indicating his first name is Roger?

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Were you getting poor grades?

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[REDACTED] I was getting poor grades, ah, during my Freshman year.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. And did your parents have a meeting with the principal and Brother Roger about getting some tutoring?

[REDACTED] Yes, sir, they did.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And what did they come to the conclusion of?

[REDACTED] That, ah, I needed tutoring to, um, bring my grade up in that class.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And who was to be your tutor?

[REDACTED] Um, Brother Roger was to be my tutor.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. Up until that time, [REDACTED] had Brother Roger ever inappropriately touched you, or made any unappropriate comments, or anything of any sexual nature towards you?

[REDACTED] No, sir, he didn't.

I think it was the third floor, but his room overlooked the courtyard, I believe where the basketball, um, court, somewhere where also cars could park in-between the U shape of the building in the back.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And it had been decided that this would be the location where your tutoring would take place?

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[REDACTED] Um, I believe that decision probably came from Brother Roger. Versus in a classroom, but yes, that was where the tutoring took place was in his personal bedroom.

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DETECTIVE DUNHAM: That's where you were told to go?

[REDACTED] Yes.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. Did your parents know that that's where the location of the tutoring was going to be?

[REDACTED] Yes.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: All right. And when was the tutoring supposed to take place?

[REDACTED] After the regular school day.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: So to the best of your recollection, that would be late afternoon hours?

[REDACTED] The late afternoon hours, yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. Can you tell me about the first time you went to his room for tutoring, and can you describe his room for me please, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The first time I went to his room, um, we actually did do tutoring. Um, you, ...as far as a description of his room, you walked into his room from the hallway. The door swung in, and to the left was his bed. Behind his bed on the left hand wall was, ah, I would say, maybe at the foot of his bed was his desk with a chair behind that, and some bookshelves. Where the door opened to the right hand wall there were bookshelves. Beyond those bookshelves was another door, um, on that right hand wall, which was his bed., bathroom, rather, and to the left of that door was a window that overlooked that courtyard.

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DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. And you mentioned earlier, this was during your Freshman year. Is that correct?

[REDACTED]: Yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And how old, to the best of your recollection, were you during this time frame?

[REDACTED]: 13, 14 years old.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: 13 or 14. Okay. Ah, 25..., over 25 years later, do you feel confident that you could locate this room right now, if, if you needed to go over there and find this room.

[REDACTED]: I probably could, yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. And, you mentioned, ah, several moments ago that during the first tutoring session, no assaults took place, but rather actual tutoring.

[REDACTED]: Actual tutoring did take place during the first couple of, um.....

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: During the first one or two?

[REDACTED]: Yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. Let's, let's draw your attention to the first time, ah, an assault took place. Can you tell me about that afternoon, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]: Um, he would always start off by doing tutoring, and, um, you know, the tutoring was a couple hours long, and the, the first time he assaulted me, he put his hands upon my buttocks, um, and caressed them, I guess you would say.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Was this over the clothing, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED]: This was over the clothing. Yes, sir.

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DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And what happened after that?

[REDACTED] Um, pretty much that was the end of the first tutoring session. When I came back for the next tutoring session, um, I did get tutored again, um, in the history class, and after the tutoring, he would start the fondling by rubbing my buttocks again, and progressively he got to, ah, rub..., rubbing my crotch area.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And this was over the clothing, initially?

[REDACTED] This was still over the clothing, yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. And how many tutoring sessions were you scheduled for weekly?

[REDACTED] Two to three.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Two to three. And, after the assaults began, did the assaults occur every time you went there for tutoring?

[REDACTED] Yes, they did.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Without missing a time?

[REDACTED] No, they never missed a time of assault. Ah, as a matter of fact, the assaults got, um, it became more assault than tutoring.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: So as time went on, the tutoring became pretty much secondary to the assaults?

[REDACTED] Yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And the assaults became more graphic?

[REDACTED] Yes, they did.

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DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. Ah, you mentioned earlier that he started to get to the point where he was actually reaching under your clothing, and he was masturbating. Is that correct? 1785

[REDACTED] Yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Do you recall the first time that happened?

[REDACTED] Um, not an actual date, but, ah, it was, ah, probably six or seven times into the tutoring, where he actually started reaching in underneath my clothing, and actually putting his hands upon my, my actual buttocks, and my private areas.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. And you also mentioned that he began to perform oral sex on you. Is that true?

[REDACTED] Yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Ah, can you explain the first time that happened? Was it in his room again?

[REDACTED] Yes, it was in his room. He had actually, um, during his, ah, assaults, progressively getting worse, um, eventually got my pants down. Um, down around my ankles area, and he actually bent me over his, ah, his desk. Ah, putting his hand across my face in order to, ah, shield my eyes from what he was to do, and he placed my penis in his mouth and performed oral sex upon me while he was masturbating.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Did you have an erection during this time?

[REDACTED] Yes, I did.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. And, the first time this happened was in his room?

[REDACTED] Yes, sir.

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DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. And you..., did you see him masturbating?

[REDACTED] Yes, I did. I could see between his fingers what he was doing, and also feel, ah, his masturbation, ah, on my inner legs. Um, and at one point in time, I could actually hear him ejaculate onto his tile floor.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: All right. And, you also mentioned that this started to happen..., this became a frequent occurrence?

[REDACTED] Yes, it did.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: This pattern of abuse?

[REDACTED] Yes.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Similar to the, the fondling, which would lead to him taking your penis out, performing oral sex, and then he would masturbate himself?

[REDACTED] Yes.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: All right. You mentioned in the letter that there was a situation where he actually, ah, sodomized you. Is that correct?

[REDACTED] Yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Can you describe what happened on that incident? You mentioned it happened twice?

[REDACTED] Yes, it happened two times, that's the best that I can recall. He would start out by, ah, pushing me back over his desk again, with my back to the desk, and perform oral sex upon me, and then he rolled me over, um, with my buttocks to him, and placed his penis in-between my buttocks and, ah, started rubbing them, and then actually was, ah, forcing his penis into me.

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DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And did he put his penis inside of you?

[REDACTED] Yes, he did.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And this happened on two separate occasions?

[REDACTED] Two separate occasions. Yes.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Both of which were in his room, [REDACTED]?

[REDACTED] Yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. During these assaults, was he saying anything to you?

[REDACTED] No. He didn't say very much at all, if anything. It was all just very heavy breathing. Um, and when he touched me, I could just feel his sweaty skin all over me.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Or, or offer you any type of bribe, or anything,

[REDACTED] No, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: not to tell anyone?

[REDACTED] No, sir. Not to my recollection.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: During these assaults, did you ever try to fight him off, or ever try to defend yourself in any way?

[REDACTED] When he was entering me from my, ah, anus, I told him to stop, because it was hurting. Um, and he kept assaulting me.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. You mentioned that on two separate occasions, people walked in during these assaults in progress. Do you recall those incidents?

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[REDACTED]: Yes, sir.....Um.....

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: The first one we're going to talk about, ah, happened in a bathroom. Is that correct, [REDACTED]?

[REDACTED]: Yes, sir.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Can you describe that to me for..., for me please?

[REDACTED]: That was in the bathroom that was located, um, to the front of his classroom. Um, and I had, um, asked permission to go to the bathroom, which was generally downstairs, but this one particular time he told me to use the bathroom that he always used. Um, I had urinated, and was zipping my pants up, and had turned around, and he was standing right there, ah, looking at me, and had placed his hands down in my pants. Um, a few moments later, after he was fondling me, um, [REDACTED], had walked in, um, and had said, oops, and was wondering what had taken so long. He had said, what's going on, what's taking so long here?

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: [REDACTED] is [REDACTED] a f..., was [REDACTED] a fellow student?

[REDACTED]: He was a student in our class, yes.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. A classmate of yours?

[REDACTED]: Classmate, yes.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And, did you see [REDACTED]'s face, or how do you know it was [REDACTED] that came in?

[REDACTED]: I saw his face. I recognized his voice. I, I can remember looking at him when he had, ah, walked into the class, because I was actually turned towards the door where, um,

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Brother Roger had his back towards the door. And, when [REDACTED] had said, what's going on in here, it startled Brother Roger to the point where he had turned his head, and covered himself back up.

And he walked in, saw what was going on, I

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saw the expression on his face, and he just turned around and walked out. Closing the door behind him. And at that point in time Brother Roger went over and locked the door.

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DETECTIVE DUNHAM: After he locked the door, did the assault continue, or was, was that the end of it for that time?

[REDACTED] The assault continued.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Did, ah, Brother John Paul say anything?

[REDACTED] NNNo.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Did you try to....

[REDACTED]not that I can recall.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: ...to say anything to him?

[REDACTED] No, I did not. I was in shock as to what was going on.

ROGER ARGENCOURT: A R G E N C O U R T.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. The location is the Nashua Police Department. The time is 1146 hours. Roger, I came to see you at the Bishop Guertin High School today, ah, to talk to you about some allegations, is that correct?

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ROGER ARGENCOURT: That's correct.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And you voluntarily responded here to the police department to speak to Detective MacLeod and myself about that, is that accurate?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: That is accurate.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. And, we've made it perfectly clear to you that we are not looking to charge you criminally with any of these allegations, is that right?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: That's correct.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And you're making this statement right now of your own free will, Roger?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: Totally.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. Ah, I made mention earlier that, ah, on January 5th, an individual that used to be a student at Bishop Guertin named [REDACTED] came to the Nashua Police Department and made some allegations about you. Did I, did I explain that to you?

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. Ah, drawing your attention back to 1974, ah, a teacher, excuse me, a student there named [REDACTED]. Do you recall that student?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: I recall the student.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And was he in one of your classes?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: He was.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. And, do you recall having private tutoring sessions with him?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: I remember private tutoring sessions.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Where did these sessions take place at, Roger?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: They took place, ah, in my classroom.

ROGER ARGENCOURT: In the classroom, you mea..., in the classroom.

ROGER ARGENCOURT: Tutoring never took place in the room.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. Do you recall being in your room with [REDACTED]?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: I do.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. We mentioned earl..., earlier to you Roger, that there was allegations of, ah, fondling, of you touching, ah, [REDACTED] groin and penis area, and there was allegations of you performing oral sex on [REDACTED] while masturbating. Do you recall any of those incidents?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: I do recall some of the incidents. However, the only one I'm not sure about was masturbating, but then that probably was part of the action as well, so I ca..., I will say, yes.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. We spoke earlier about an incident in your room while there was a tennis match going on. Do you recall that incident?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: I recall the incident, and the place, yes.

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DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Okay. And would it be accurate to say that during that incident that you performed oral sex on [REDACTED]?

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ROGER ARGENCOURT: Yes, it would.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: And, you mentioned earlier that you do remember having an orgasm during that specific incident. Do you remember that?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: I do remember.

DETECTIVE DUNHAM: Was that a result of you masturbating?

ROGER ARGENCOURT: I don't recall if it was that, or if it was my rubbing my penis against him.

ROGER ARGENCOURT: The, ah, it was a spiritual renewal session that took place at _____(inaudible) Crystal Center in, ah, outside Santa Fe, New Mexico. And it's for a period of 100 days. And at that particular point there, you'd have psychologists. They'd test you psychologically, and all the else would have spiritual, um, directors, of whom I had opened myself to, at that particular point. I was enrolled as a freshman in Bishop Guertin High School (I believe it was the fall/spring of 1974, 1975) when the following events took place. Shortly after I started school, I had problems keeping my grades up to par. My parents spoke with Farther Rogers who at the time was the principle of the school about one of the many subjects I was failing (history). The teacher was Brother Rogers, and his classroom was located above the gym. After speaking with both the principle and the teacher, my parents made arrangements for the teacher to tutor me for two hours each day after school.

At the time, my father was [REDACTED] my mother was involved in [REDACTED] and my brother was the [REDACTED] I felt obligated to go to this school and keep my grades up, and this was the way to do so.

After my parents made arrangements to have me tutored, I started the classes after school, I can't remember the exact day the abuse started, but I believe it was after two or three tutoring sessions. I remember Brother Rogers placing his hands on my buttocks and rubbing them. Then his hands moved to my crotch area. At this point, I can remember being scared and confused about what was happening. This was about as far as it got the first time. I did not want to tell my parents fearing rejection and humiliation and being accused of lying.

I went to school the next day and completed the regular classes. After school that evening, Brother Rogers had given me some lessons in history and said I had done a good job of learning that evening. I was hoping he would not touch me again. However, he started where he had left off the previous evening by placing his hands on my buttocks then working them around to the crotch area. This time he unzipped my pants and started to fondle my private parts. As he was doing this, he was also playing with himself. I know this because I could feel his erect penis pressed on my back. Things continued in this manner for a few more days.

When I went to see him for more tutoring the next week, once again he would work with my studies and then begin to fondle me. It wasn't long before it became more fondling than studying.

One evening after unzipping my pants and fondling me for quite a long time, he had placed his hand on my forehead and pushed me backwards onto a table and took my penis into his mouth and proceeded to give me oral sex while he was masturbating himself. I can remember feeling his erection slapping me on the leg! He masturbated to the point of orgasm, and I could hear the semen hit the tile floor, all this while he was still performing oral sex on me.

I was dazed and confused about what was going on and kept wondering what I had done wrong to deserve this.

I felt so humiliated and still could not tell my parents for fear they would not believe me and that I would be punished for lying about a teacher. One day during history class I needed to go to the restroom, which was across the gym. The teacher told me to use the one in the front of the classroom, which was odd because no one was allowed to use this bathroom--it was Brother Rogers bathroom. I was just finishing in the bathroom when the door opened. It was Brother Rogers. He placed his hands down my pants and started fondling my penis. At this point another student [REDACTED] walked into the room and said "what is taking you so long?" [REDACTED] saw what was happening and then said, "oops" and left. I guess seeing what was going on shocked him. I remember the teacher's face turning beet red. Brother Rogers stopped what he was doing and went back to class.

That evening at tutoring it continued (the same style of fondling in the same way, his hands in my pants on my private parts). This time, I was at the side of the table while Brother Rogers was fondling me, when Brother John Paul, my Math teacher walked in and saw what was going on. He simply turned around and walked out. Once again Brother Rogers face turned beet red. Brother Rogers walked over to the door and locked it (they were not supposed to lock their doors; I can only guess it was against policy). Next, he continued his sexual assault on me by bending me over the table and performing oral sex on me. Again, all the while masturbating. This time however, he rolled me over on the tabletop face down and placed his penis on my buttocks and rubbed them with it (I could feel liquid from him). He spread my buttocks apart and pressed his penis on my anus and pushed it trying to enter me. I tried to squeeze my buttocks together but he kept pushing, then he penetrated me. I said, "please stop please stop," but he just kept assaulting me. I was so scared and didn't know WHAT to do. He would always zip my pants up when he was finished with me, and pat me on the back and say "see you tomorrow night." One time he fondled my penis so much it was swollen for two days!! I was afraid my parents would see me when I was going to the bathroom and ask me what happened.

Another time he ejaculated on my stomach then leaned over and licked it up. One day I remember my mother picked me up after tutoring and asked me what was wrong. I said "nothing," fearing I would be punished and rejected by her and my father. Shortly afterwards I told my parents that I did not want to go back any more. Somehow I had blocked these memories out of my mind, fearing I would get in trouble if anybody knew what had happened.

In the spring of 2000, my father was visiting and mentioned that my nephew had been accepted at Bishop Guertin. I was in shock! My wife had asked me if something was wrong. Yet again, so many years later I felt humiliated, confused and scared. This brought back very bad memories, memories that I had forgotten about for so long. In the fall of 2000, I was in New England having Thanksgiving dinner with my family. [REDACTED]


[REDACTED]. During an enrollment interview, one of the teachers asked her if I was a related to her son. It was Brother Rogers--the teacher who assaulted me years before. I am not sure how he made the connection [REDACTED] My only guess is that [REDACTED] and remembered what he had done to me so many years ago. Fearing for my nephew, I told [REDACTED] what had happened to me. [REDACTED] was the first person that I had EVER mentioned this abuse to in over 26 years. I asked her to change teachers or to do *something* so [REDACTED] son would not be exposed to this teacher potentially having the same thing done to him that was done to me.

[REDACTED] talked with me about it for sometime and had said [REDACTED] would talk to [REDACTED] husband about it. We had another discussion about what had happened. [REDACTED] and her husband decided only that they would talk to their son in such a manner that he would not know what had happened to me, but would make him aware that this teacher or any other, should not be putting his or her hands on him. I feel that this teacher could and would touch him in the way he did me.

I can't help but feel this teacher has done this to others also. I feel the need to revisit and face the past, which has been buried for so many years to ensure this man NEVER hurts anyone again! After speaking with my counselor about what happened to me when I was a child, more and more memories have come to mind. I am trying to come to terms with and learn how to deal with this situation.

One additional memory that is extremely vivid was when we were in his class, Brother Rogers would always stand behind a podium in front of the class. There were several times

during the year while in class, Brother Rogers' face would turn red and he would start sweating profusely. Then all of a sudden he would pull his black gown off, saying "I'm HOT." He would then bring the gown to his room. A few moments later he would come back to class with a gown back on. It makes me wonder why he would do this...all that comes to mind is that he was masturbating in front of the class behind the podium and under his gown. Upon ejaculating he would have to change his gown so the students would not see a stain on the front of the gown. I did not understand what he was doing back then, but it is very clear to me now what he probably was doing.

1. On January 4, 2002, I reported to the Nashua Police Department that I had been sexually assaulted while a student at Bishop Guertin by a man identified as Brother Roger.
2. On January 5, 2002, I reviewed a copy of my brother's 1974 Bishop Guertin yearbook entitled "Mitre."
3. Upon review of the 1974 yearbook, I am able to positively identify Brother Roger Argencourt as pictured on page 71 of the yearbook as the man who sexually assaulted me as reported to the Nashua Police Department.
4. I am also able to positively identify Brother John Paul Monat, as pictured on page 73 of the yearbook, as the teacher who walked into the room while a sexual assault was taking place as reported to the Nashua Police Department.
5. I am also able to positively identify [REDACTED] as pictured on page 74 of the yearbook, as the father of [REDACTED] the student who walked into the bathroom while a sexual assault was taking place as reported to the Nashua Police Department.



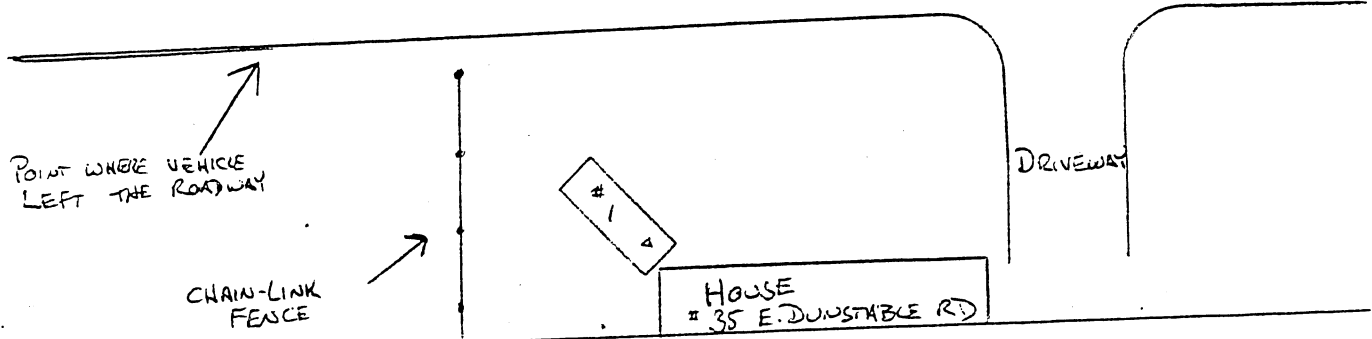
