The Rev. Daniel Michael Lally

Priest served N. Kentucky parishes for more than 40 years

The Rev. Daniel Michael Lally was a "people's priest," a teacher and pastor of a number of Roman Catholic churches in the Covington Diocese.

"He loved to be with people and mostly enjoyed being a parish priest," said his long-time colleague and friend, the Rev. Anthony Deye of St. Henry Parish.

Father Lally, 74, died Friday at Carmel Manor, where he had been living for more than a year.

"He particularly enjoyed ministering to young people," said the Rev. Thomas Sacksteder, spokesman for the diocese. "He was an affable priest, always with a smile and never met a stranger."

Father Lally was ordained in Frankfort, Ky., in 1948. He served pastorates in many parishes beginning as assistant pastor at St. Mary parish in Covington. For a time, he was on faculty at Newport Catholic High School.

When he retired in 1986, he was pastor of St. Anthony Church in Taylor Mill. He then lived at St. John Parish rectory in Covington.

He is survived by two cousins, Edward and Richard Lynch of Frankfort, Ky.; a niece, Eleanor Clay of Danville, Ky.; and three nephews, Edward Monohan of Crestview Hills, Ky., Dennis Monohan of Frankfort and Sean Monohan of San Francis-

co. Visitation will be 4 p.m. Monday at St. Agnes Church on Dixie Highway in Fort Wright. Mass of Christian burial will be 10 a.m. Tuesday at the church.

Burial will be in the family plot in Frankfort Cemetery in Frankfort, Ky.
